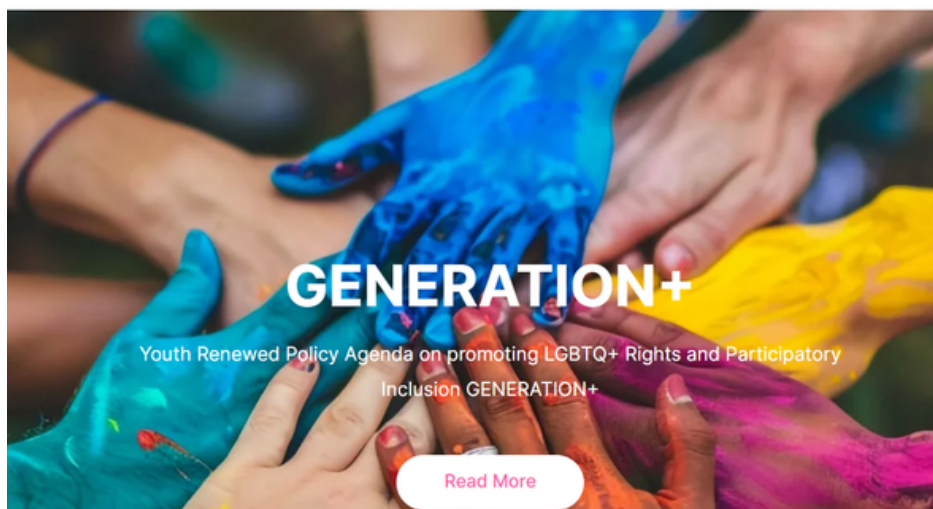
A dynamic youth organization fostering cross-cultural exchanges, civic engagement, and education.
